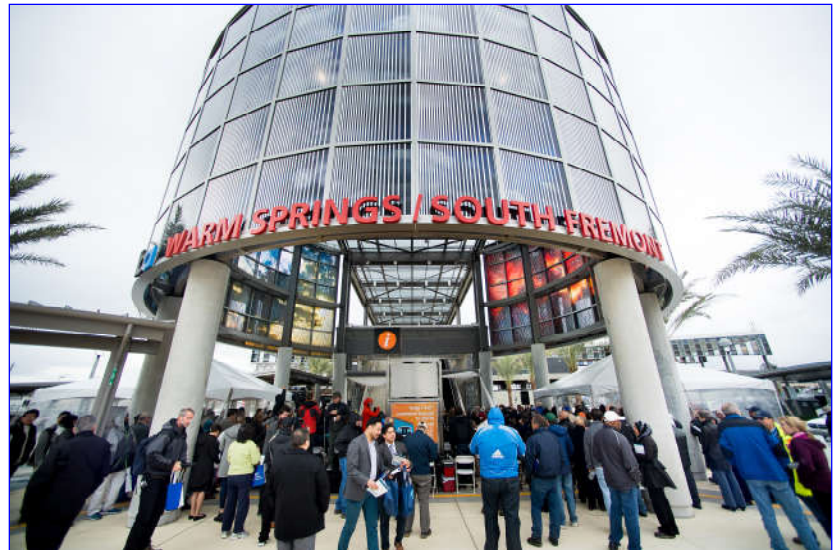
CTF Transportation Award Winners Shine
